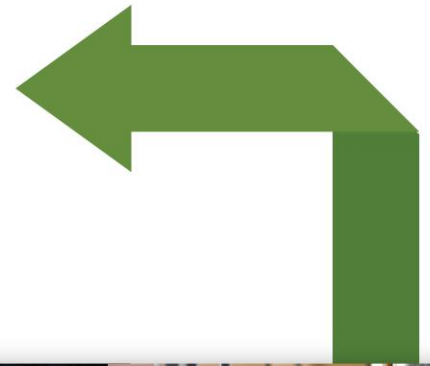

The Accelerated Training for Illinois Manufacturing (ATIM) is for individuals interested in getting or advancing their skills in one of four high-demand areas of manufacturing. Right now, over 10,000 jobs are available in Illinois for:

- Machining
- Mechatronics (Equipment Service and Repair)
- Welding
- Logistics/Inventory

For selected participants, this program will cover the costs of manufacturing skill upgrade training and nationally recognized manufacturing credentials that employers require of new hires.

Qualifying for ATIM

Eligible training participants include low-income adults and dislocated workers.



General Eligibility Requirements – Adult and Dislocated Worker*:



- 18 Years of age or older
- Authorized to work in the United States
- Compliance with Military Selective Service requirements
- Meet low-income guidelines of the Workforce Investment Act

General Eligibility Requirements - Dislocated Worker*:

- Received a layoff notice or currently laid off of work.
